- 2. In claiming to "justify the ways of God to men" is Milton guilty of quasi-Satanic pride? Give reasons for your answer.
- 3. Is Aphra Behn's *The Rover* a feminist play or does it reinforce a "masculine set of values"? Give reasons for your answer.
- 4. "Manifestly, Belinda is at the centre of the Pope's fictional universe... ideologically, she is at its margins." Do you agree? Illustrate your answer with examples from the text.
- 5. The seventeenth century shows a distinct representation of women that counters a traditional one. Explore this dimension with reference to Margaret Cavendish's science fiction story "The Description of a New World, Called The Blazing World".
- 6. The seventeenth century has been seen as an age of crisis leading to far-reaching changes in England. Explore how writers represented issues around monarchy and power in any one of the texts in this paper.
