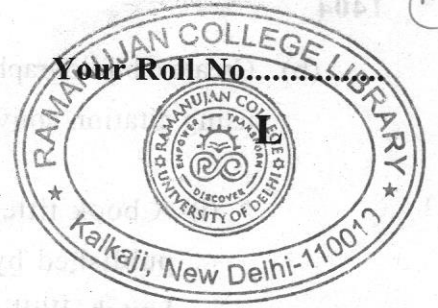

2. (a) What is a research gap and how do we arrive at it? Explain with a brief reference to your research paper.

(b) Create a bibliography by arranging the following entries in the correct sequence using citation conventions discussed in the MLA 9th edition:

- (i) A book titled *The Norton Anthology of Theory and Criticism* was published by Norton in 2018. The book was edited by Vincent B. Leitch, William E. Cain
- (ii) The article "Bad Feminist" was published by Roxane Gay in the journal titled *Signs*. The article was carried in the issue number 4 of the fourth volume of the journal published in 2015 and extended from page number 791 to 801. It was accessed from JSTOR database.
- (iii) Smith Jane wrote the Introduction titled *The Evolution to Literary Theory to the book Literary Analysis in the 21st Century*. The book was published by Academic Press in 2020. The page range of the Introduction is 1-10. The book was co-edited by Mark Johnson and Lisa Taylor.
- (iv) Robert Frost's poem *Mending Wall* was published in a collection of his poetry titled *The Poetry of Robert Frost* in 1969. The book was edited by Edward Connery Lathem and published by Cambridge University Press.
- (v) Khaled Hosseini's novel *The Kite Runner* was published in 2003 by Riverhead Books.

7. (a) Applying any methodology of your choice, analyse any primary text that you have studied for your research paper.
