

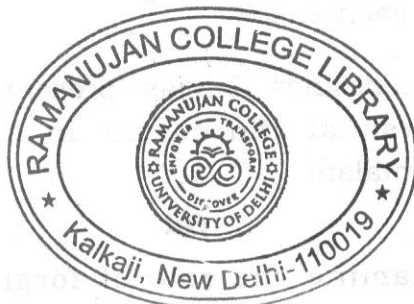
6. (a) Compare Cenkuttuvan's idea of kingship before and after his encounter with Kannaki's story.
